Experience Days

For children considering joining our Upper School we offer 'Experience Days'. Year 5 Gifted and Talented pupils are invited to take part in an 'Out of this World' Space Discovery Day; Year 7 candidates are invited to join us for a 'Crime Solving Day'. Taster Days

Once a candidate is registered to join Meoncross, they will receive an invitation to join their current year group for two consecutive taster days. During this time they will take part in a normal school day and be assessed according to their age.

ADMISSIONS POLICY

Meoncross School is committed to operating a fair and transparent admissions policy.

It is the decision of the Headmistress as to whether the applicant will benefit from an education at Meoncross and contribute fully to the life of the school.

Aims & Objectives

- To apply the admissions regulations equally to all who wish to attend the school.
- To not disadvantage any child by virtue of gender, race, religion or disability.
- To provide an equal opportunity for all children to have their potential identified.
- To handle all applications in a sensitive and confidential manner.
- To keep an even distribution of boys and girls in each class, where possible.

Entry Points

Entry is at any point from Nursery to Year 12 (2 ½ to 17 years) and at any stage in the academic year, subject to the availability of places.

Pupils from the Upper Nursery, Year 3 and Year 6 will ordinarily continue to the next stage of their education at Meoncross, rising to the Lower and Upper Schools respectively.

Application Process

Providing there is availability in the relevant year group, candidates are invited to the school for assessment.

Places are offered on the basis of the successful fulfilment of the selection process:

- Registration on our admissions list
- Two consecutive 'taster' days at the school
- Academic assessments in numeracy, literacy and reasoning, appropriate to the age of the applicant
- Assessment of applicant's sociability and interaction amongst their peer group
- An interview with the Headmistress
- A recent academic report

Parents accept a place by completing the Acceptance form and paying the Admissions deposit.

The Headteacher reserves the right to admit or refuse any pupil. A full term's written notice is required by the first day of term before a pupil is removed from the school. In the absence of such notice, the full term's fees must be paid.

Breakfast Club

8:00am – 8:30am

Breakfast Club is available for Nursery pupils and Infants in the Nursery and includes breakfast; it takes place in the Dining Hall for Junior and Upper School pupils who may purchase from a selection of hot and cold choices.

After School Care

3:45 – 6:00pm

After School Care is available for Nursery and Lower School children, and includes a high tea of sandwiches, cake, fruit and a drink.

A supervised free homework session is available for Upper School pupils in the Geography room.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

The school operates four bus routes to and from the school available to all children in the Lower and Upper Schools. Places may be booked termly in advance, for the whole week or individual days, one way or return trips. Places are allocated on a first come, first serve basis. Pupils may use the school bus on an ad hoc basis where there are seats available. A schedule of current routes and charges is available to download from our website. NURSERY SESSIONS & CHARGES

Meoncross Nursery is open for 48 weeks of the year from 8am until 6pm, Monday to Friday. In addition during term time Nursery is open from 7.30am.

Sessions

Early Bird	07:30 – 08:00
Breakfast	08:00 - 09:00
Core Morning	09:00 – 12:00
Lunch	12:00 - 13:00
Core Afternoon	13:00 – 16:00
After School	16:00 – 18:00 by the half hour

Children can attend any combination of core sessions, combined with any combination of before and after school care and lunch.

Minimum Sessions

Seahorses - we advise a minimum of three core sessions, to enable them to settle and take full advantage of the nursery curriculum.

Starfish - we advise a minimum of six core sessions a week, in preparation for full time school in the following September.

Charges

8:00am – 4:00pm	£6.80 per hour
4:00pm – 6:00pm	£3.40 per half hour
7:30am – 8:00am	£4.37 per half hour

Lunch, snacks and all activities are included in the hourly charge. Educational trips, not including Beach School, may incur an additional charge.

Adding or Changing Sessions

Sessions can be added to or swapped at any time according to availability; cancellation of sessions requires one term's notice in writing.

After School Care

After school care is chargeable by the half hour and can be booked in advance or taken ad hoc.

Early Years Funding

Three and four year olds can claim their 15 free hours at Meoncross from the term after their third birthday. Hours in addition to the 15 free hours are charged at the advertised rate.

Enhanced Provision Charge

The am and pm core sessions include Ballet, French, Music, PE and Beach School taught by qualified teachers/specialist staff. There is an enhanced provision charge of £2 for every free hour claimed by children eligible for the EYE Grant during these core sessions.

Childcare Vouchers

We accept a wide range of childcare vouchers which can be used to pay for any nursery sessions.
